Background

The Liberty Litigation Settlement awarded \$1,138,253 to Mono County. The Mono County Board of Supervisors has designated these funds to be used exclusively for the benefit of the Antelope Valley community. This allocation represents a significant opportunity to invest in projects, services, and improvements that directly support Antelope Valley residents.

Recommended Action

Mono County staff is seeking community input and suggestions on how these funds should be used.

Discussion

Liberty Utilities was found at fault for the Mountain View Fire, which significantly impacted the Antelope Valley community. Through the litigation process, settlement funds were awarded to affected residents as well as to Mono County. The total amount awarded to Mono County was \$1,138,253.

The Mono County Board of Supervisors has directed that these settlement funds be used exclusively to support the Antelope Valley community. This ensures that the resources are invested in projects, services, and improvements that directly benefit the area most affected by the fire.

Mono County staff is seeking community input and suggestions to present to the Board of Supervisors regarding how these funds can be most effectively utilized. Community feedback will help identify priorities and guide the development of recommendations for the allocation of these resources.
