

Cunningham Lane Bridge (PW)

- Paint bridge

Walker Community Center Upgrades (PW)

Can include any or all depending on funding:

- HVAC system upgrades
- MERV-13 or higher HVAC filters
- Indoor air quality monitors (PM2.5, CO₂, temperature, humidity)
- Extension cords (commercial-grade, heavy-duty)
- Portable partitions or privacy screens)
- Digital signage or emergency notification boards
- Shade structures or window coverings for heat mitigation
- Backup power solutions (generators, battery storage, solar backup systems)
- Night lighting
- ADA-accessible ramps or temporary mobility access equipment
- Shower trailers or portable hygiene stations
- Cot Covers, Pillows and towels for sheltering
- Refrigerators/freezers for medications and food storage
- Kitchen equipment for community meals

Sustainable Outdoors (PW)

- Mountain Gate Park – preliminary planning
- OHV management

Road Department (PW)

- Replace two culverts on Mill Canyon
- Install standpipe for filling water trucks at the Walker Road Shop – this would permit water trucks to be filled up in a reasonable timeframe both for general Rd Dept use and fire related issues.

Walker Main Street

- Colorized shoulders/bike lanes. (MCO Ideabook)
- Widen sidewalks. (MCO Ideabook)
- Transform the existing memorial to the 2002 crash of a C-130 firefighting tanker into the western gateway to the town. (MCO Ideabook)
- Formalize the ESTA bus stop with a drive-through lane for buses. Create space to plant landscaping. (MCO Ideabook)
- Build a pedestrian bridge to span Mill Creek. Work with property owners to create a small outdoor gathering space along the river. (MCO Ideabook)
- Improved signage on 395, identifying the town. (Eastern Sierra Corridor Enhancement Program)

Safety

- Residents of the area would like greater enforcement of vehicles passing in unsafe areas throughout the Valley. (RTP)
- Consider the installation of call boxes where cell service is lacking or where it is unlikely cell service would ever be successful due to topography. (RTP)
- Build additional water storage for emergency wildfire use. (MJHMP)
- Add "clean air" HVAC systems to the Walker Community Center to improve the community center's ability to serve as a shelter during emergencies. (MJHMP)

Recreation

- Topaz Lake: designate a boat launching area to provide boat access within California and to protect critical water bird nesting and rearing habitat. (AV Area Plan)
- Pursue trail easements. Combined enjoyment among users such as hikers, bicyclists, off-road vehicles, equestrians and runners shall be encouraged where practical. (AV Area Plan)
- Identify a loop route throughout the Valley for use by touring bicyclists, pedestrians and equestrians. Develop single-use or multi-purpose trails. (RTP)
- Develop mountain biking opportunities along the West Walker River, for example, from the Sonora Bridge to Walker, along the river and/or parallel to Burcham Flat Road. (RTP)
- Address concerns over parking, access, and potential impacts to private property at the corner of Eastside Lane and US 395. (RTP, Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)
- Construct a trail connecting Walker to the amenities of Mountain Gate. (MCO Ideabook)
- Make the Mountain Gate fishing platform accessible to pedestrians and bicyclists. (MCO Ideabook)
- West Walker River Access. (MCO Ideabook)
- Sustainable trails within Mountain Gate Park. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)
- Shade, picnic tables and seating within Mountain Gate Park. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)
- Directional signage off of US 395 to existing park facilities. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)

Transportation

- Improve private roads, with the goal of including them in the county road system. (RTP)
- Consider additional landscaping along US 395 in appropriate areas. (RTP)
- Support preservation of the existing heritage trees along US 395 in a manner that ensures roadway safety. (RTP)
- Seek grant funding (such as the Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant) to implement the Scenic Byway Main Street plan and other traffic calming features in cooperation with business owners, Caltrans, and the Regional Planning Advisory Committee. (RTP)
- Consider supporting improvements to intermodal connections to adjacent communities (Antelope Valley and Mono Basin). (RTP)
- Repair/replace bridges on Cunningham and Larson Lane. (RTP)

Wildlife

- Enhancement of deer habitat on the west side of 395 to reduce the number of highway crossings. (RTP)
- Enhance available water and forage for deer. (RTP)
- Install additional deer-crossing warning signs. (RTP)
- Establish roadside turnouts/deer view areas (these would be more appropriate in the Eastside Lane area, although interpretive signs directing people to Eastside Lane may be appropriate on US 395). (RTP)
- Establish screening vegetation for deer around Marine housing complex, in cooperation with BLM and Marine Corps. (RTP)
- Widen shoulders to allow for vehicle turnouts and scenic viewing. (RTP)
- Planting native vegetation and shade trees in Mountain Gate Park. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)
- Removal of invasive species within Mountain Gate Park. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)
- Riparian restoration within Mountain Gate Park. (Mountain Gate Park Recreation and Revitalization)

Housing

- Weatherization and rehabilitation programs for existing housing. (6th Cycle Housing Element)
- Homebuyer assistance program. (6th Cycle Housing Element)

Fuel Management

- Pilot Fuels Treatment Project. Part of the Walker River Riparian Project, which encompasses fuels reduction work on approximately 66 acres of County-owned land along the Walker River Corridor. The pilot project would cover a single parcel in the Mountain Gate Park, and provide leverage for a much larger grant to fund the entire Walker River Riparian Project. (Office of Emergency Management)
