


After Godzilla El Niño, What's this Winter to Bring?






What Fall Has Brought So Far?




- Early season atmospheric rivers Oct 14-16

101 - El Niño vs La Niña vs The Blob






Forecast Ocean State for Winter




Does La Niña Even Matter to Us?




55% Chance of La Nina... 100% Chance of "I Don't Know"

What Does This Mean for Me?

- Prepare for this winter like you would any other snow, wind, flood, drought
- No signals on frequency of wind storms, strong inversions, cold air outbreaks.
- Consider dusting off flood plans and incorporating a flood scenario into pre-winter training, exercises.

Why Is Housing So Important?

- California has more than one third of the nation's chronically homeless
- California's recidivism rate is among the highest in the nation:

61% of inmates released returned to prison or jail within three years

Mono County:

- Currently Mono County Behavioral Health has twelve individuals who qualify for Permanent Supportive Housing and who would benefit from Davison House
- Last January, the Consortium of Care counted 63 homeless people in Inyo, Mono, and Alpine counties
- Mono County currently spends approximately \$59K per year on housing assistance, board, and care for six clients. We expect this number to increase.
- We may have to ask for money from General Fund if we are unable to establish housing for **MCBH** clients


Solution: Permanent Supportive Housing at Davison House

- Permanent Supportive Housing combines low-barrier affordable housing and supportive services to help people succeed in their daily lives
- MCBH won the CSAC Award for Whole-Person Wellness
- ► Housing would be an extension of our current award-winning work
- us to create recovery- and treatment-centered housing Allows us to meet mental health mandates and allows for individuals involved in our re-entry program
- Considering the high rates and costs of recidivism, Permanent Supportive Housing could help reduce County General Fund costs.

Davison: Quick Look

- 7,500 square feet
- ► House:
- > 5 bedrooms
- 3 Baths
- Shared kitchen & living room
- Apartment building:
- Four 2-bedroom, 1 bath apartments
- Near trolley/bus stops
- Can house up to 26 residents
- Large room ideal for encouraging pro-social interactions



History

- The Davison property was originally a residential treatment program. Due to budget cuts, it became a sober living facility for men only.
- Davison House was previously called "Eastern Sierra Passages Lodge" and "Eastern Sierra Transitions."
- 1990-1997: Mono County rents Davison property.
- 1997: Mono County buys Davison property for \$392K.
- 2008: Davison property is still open, but has no full-time on-site staff.
- 2011: Due to budget cuts, it is decided that Davison property should be closed. Eleven people need to be relocated as a result.
- 2011: Davison property is appraised and put on market.
- > One last minute bid (\$325K) fell through and the house has been unoccupied since.

Budget & Sustainability

- \$2 million for Renovation and Repairs
- ADA compliance
- Fire safety
- Asbestos abatement
- Replacement of plumbing and wiring for long-term sustainability
- MHSA (Mental Health Services Act) capital funding will cover all costs
- Ongoing sustainability established with no cost to Mono County General Fund
- Plans for upkeep and maintenance established no added burden to Public Works' Facilities Department
- Demolition has been considered, but due to funding and timing constraints, Behavioral Health thinks that renovating the building is a better option



Conclusion

- Davison is an opportunity for Mono County BH to collaborate with many systems within the county and community
- > Provides housing, but also provides comprehensive, evidencebased direct service in one place
- Positions Mono County to be ahead of the curve on the Governor Brown's No Place Like Home Initiative
- Davison House helps those in our county who are the most vulnerable
