RE: Release of Tioga Inn Specific Plan and Final Subsequent Environmental Impact Report

Honorable Board of Supervisors,

In the interest of preserving the integrity and transparency of Mono County's California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) decision-making process and its commitment to Mono County's constituents, and to adequately informing and involving the public in the CEQA decision-making process, we urge Mono County to hold at least one public workshop in advance of any decision-making public meetings to be held by the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors on the Final Tioga Inn Specific Plan and Final Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (SP/FSEIR).

The Mono Basin community is deeply concerned about the recent announcement (January 8) by Mono County Community Development staff at the Mono Basin Regional Planning Advisory Committee that there are no longer plans to host a public workshop. We are asking that Mono County uphold previous verbal commitments made at a County-sponsored field trip (September 19, 2019) and at other meetings to hold a public workshop in Lee Vining to explain the final proposed Tioga Inn project to members of the community and public-at-large. The public, and particularly residents of the Mono Basin in close proximity to the project, has a right to know how the County addressed its comments and concerns, resolved relevant issues, and to learn about the final steps in the CEQA process, including the procedure for filing grievances.

As you are aware, the County received more than 1,000 comments on the Tioga Inn Specific Plan and Draft Subsequent EIR (DSEIR). These comments reflected the intense amount of interest by members of the public in the proposed project, including by County residents and visitors from afar. We know that Mono County has a strong commitment to conservation of natural resources and preservation of quality of life for local residents, and we believe the County should host a workshop to explain how residents' comments and concerns have been addressed in the final project proposal to promote transparency in decision-making that may affect the County's natural and cultural resources. Thus we believe it's imperative that the County honor its previous promise to openly share the results of its analysis of comments on the SP/DSEIR and explain the changes that were made to the document by holding the requested public workshop on the SP/FSEIR.

In closing we believe an informational workshop is essential to the public process and to the public's trust in the integrity and transparency of the Mono County Board of Supervisors' decision-making process.

PH Fund Balance = Unspent Realignment Revenues






