
CalSAWS will be the case management system for county eligibility staff

 Migrate all 58 Counties to **one** integrated system


Currently there are three (3) different eligibility systems in use across California


Mono County Eligibility belongs to Consortium IV (C-IV)



What's the big deal about CalSAWS?


- ❖ **50,000** county users of our three SAWS eligibility systems
- ❖ **15 million** Californians - benefit eligibility determinations
- ❖ Counties maintain Medi-Cal eligibility for **14.5 million** individuals
- ❖ The average projected CalWORKs/Welfare to Work caseload for 2020-2021 is 363,095 cases amounting to **\$4.7 billion** in grants, services, childcare, mental health and substance abuse services.
- ❖ Counties determined eligibility for the CalFresh program for 4,666,504 individuals amounting to **\$742,197,204** issued. (Sept 2020)

- Act as Change Champions




On September 27, 2021, all C-IV counties will be merging with Los Angeles County to use the CalSAWS System.

By October 2023, all CalWIN counties will be joining the CalSAWS counties.

5 Things To Know About CaISAWS

What is CaISAWS?
CaISAWS stands for the California Statewide Automated Welfare System. It will house all 58 California Counties and replace the existing C-IV, LRS, and CalWIN systems.

Who is building this?
CaISAWS is being built by the CaISAWS Consortium and vendor partners working hand-in-hand with California's 58 counties under one roof. It streamlines functions and provides users with a seamless experience that is secure and easily accessible.

Why?
Per federal mandate, CaISAWS unites all of California's 58 counties under one roof. It streamlines functions and provides users with a seamless experience that is secure and easily accessible.


How?
LRS is being transformed into CaISAWS, which has the look and feel of the C-IV system but with more robust automation. The CaISAWS Project is preparing a set of key implementation Readiness activities, including User Acceptance Testing (UAT), Data Conversion Clean-up, and Web-based Trainings (WBTs).

Spotlight on 5 CaISAWS Enhancements

- Multi-Month EDBC**
You'll be able to run multiple months of EDBC to calculate benefits more efficiently.
- View History**
A "View History" button has been added to the data collection pages so the User can see the "Transaction History Detail" page.
- Preview Notices of Action (NOAs)**
A "Preview NOAs" button was added to the "EDBC List" page so the User can view the NOA before saving EDBC.
- Homeless Assistance (HA)**
You may run Temporary HA and Permanent HA concurrently, and research issuances and split payments.
- Inter-County Transfer**
A single CaISAWS system to transfer a case from one County to another any system compatible.
