On March 26, 2020, your Board adopted Ordinance No. ORD20-02 adding Chapter 7.93 to the Mono County Code to temporarily prohibit residential and commercial evictions arising from income loss or substantial medical expenses related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This prohibition will expire on May 31, 2020, unless extended.

Since the adoption of the moratorium by the County, California Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-37-20, which prevents the enforcement of eviction orders for residential tenants affected by COVID-19 through May 31, 2020. It is unclear at this time whether the State will extend its order.

Also since the County adopted its moratorium, the Federal Government passed the CARES ACT, which protects tenants against eviction for nonpayment of rent, if the dwelling is a property insured, guaranteed, supplemented, protected, or assisted in any way by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, the rural housing voucher program, or the Violence Against Women Act of 1994. This protection lasts until July 25, 2020.

The CARES Act also protects borrowers with federally-backed mortgage loans by enacting a temporary moratorium on foreclosure until the sooner of the termination date of the coronavirus national emergency or December 31, 2020.

Finally, the Judicial Council adopted an emergency rule, which in essence prohibits courts from taking formal action on unlawful detainer filings (eviction actions), with an exception for those required by public health and safety, until 90 days after the Governor declares that the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic is lifted, or until amended or repealed by the Judicial Council.

Staff is requesting direction from the Board on whether it wishes to extend the local moratorium. Depending on the direction provided at today's meeting, staff will either return with a proposed extension at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting or the moratorium will expire on May 31, 2020.
