BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY – PURPLE TIER

- Mono County data* used to determine Tier Status:
 - 20.5 Case Rate/100,000
 - 7.2% Testing Positivity rate
- A county must have been in the current tier for a minimum of three weeks.
- A county must meet criteria for the next less restrictive tier for both measures for the prior two consecutive weeks in order to progress to the next tier.

COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED



- Vaccines are allocated by the state according to permanent resident population, <u>so vaccination</u> <u>appointments are only for people who work or live in Mono County, regardless of immigration</u> <u>status.</u>
- To ensure Mono County is administering vaccines according to <u>State guidelines</u>, proof of eligibility is now required at the vaccination clinic.
- Proof of Mono County residence or employment is required. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Driver's license/Real ID
 - U.S. Postal Service change of address
 - Employment paystub
 - \circ $\,$ Note from employer $\,$
 - o Employee ID
 - Any document that verifies you as a Mono County, full-time resident (<u>second homeowners are</u> not eligible to receive the vaccine in Mono County)

ADDRESSING VACCINE ADMINISTRATION CONCERNS

- Mono County takes the equitable distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine extremely seriously.
- We are committed to following all federal and state guidance for prioritizing persons to be vaccinated.
- We have added additional safeguards to verify the data and information entered into the State's online platforms during pre-registration, including requiring proof of eligibility upon clinic check-in.
- There are times when additional vaccine becomes available at a given clinic.
- When additional vaccine becomes available, Mono County Public Health first consults a list of individuals next scheduled to receive a vaccine.
- When unable to connect with those individuals, or to avoid waste due to the strict handling protocols of the vaccine (timing, cold storage, etc.), on occasion, individuals who do not fall within the current guidance may receive a dose.

WHERE ARE WE NOW?



Mono County is now vaccinating residents aged 55 years and older with certain underlying medical conditions, including pregnant women of any age. These individuals are at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. Some of the higher risk underlying medical conditions include:

- Cancer
- Chronic kidney disease
- COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
- Down Syndrome
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies
- Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from solid organ transplant
- Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 kg/m2 or higher but < 40 kg/m2)
- Severe Obesity (BMI \ge 40 kg/m2)
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

- The California Department of Public Health is transitioning all California counties to the My Turn platform for COVID-19 vaccine registration.
- Mono County will begin piloting the My Turn platform later this month.
- Currently pre-registered individuals will be transferred over by Mono County Public Health.



COVID-19 vaccination: Find out if it's your turn

Everyone in California will have an opportunity to get vaccinated against COVID-19 at no cost. But our vaccination supply is limited right now. So we're starting with the groups who are at highest risk, like people with a high chance of exposure and people 65 and older.

Are you eligible?

Find out if it's your turn by answering a few questions. It only takes a few minutes. If you're eligible and vaccine appointments are available through My Turn, you can schedule one. If it's not your turn yet or appointments are not available, you can register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.
