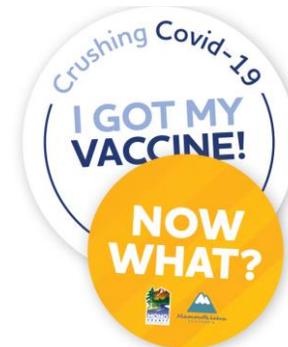



Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...




TOTAL POSITIVE CASES: 1007 (30-DAY INCREASE: 49 OR 5%)

VACCINE EQUITY METRIC

Statewide Vaccine Equity Metric Goal #2:

Orange (Moderate) tier case rate range will shift to **2-5.9 cases per 100,000**. The Yellow (Minimal) tier case rate range will shift to less than **2 cases per 100,000** when 4 million doses have been administered to persons living in Vaccine Equity Quartile 1.

As of April 1, California is 37,495 doses away from its goal.

BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY



Metrics (week ending 03/27):

- ❑ Case Rate/100,000: **12.3 (2.91)*** (case rates trending down)
 - ❑ Testing Positivity rate: **4.6% (1.8%)*** (positivity trending down)
- As the metrics show, we have met the Testing Positivity rate (2-4.9%) but not the Case Rate of less than 5.9 cases per 100,000 for the NEW Orange Tier.
- Under the new Guidelines** Mono County needs to meet BOTH metrics for 2 consecutive weeks to move to the ORANGE TIER when the new Vaccine Equity Metric goal is achieved.

SUMMARY STATUS OF MONO COUNTY RED TIER BUSINESS SECTOR OPERATIONS



- *Critical Infrastructure*
 - Open with modifications
- *Hair Salons and Barbershops*
 - Open indoors with modifications
- *Personal Care Services*
 - Open indoors with modifications
- *All Retail*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 50%** capacity
- *Restaurants*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** of capacity, or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- *Wineries, Breweries and Distilleries*
 - *Outdoor only with modifications (effective March 13)*
 - *Reservations*
 - *90-minute time limit*
 - *Seating/tables only*
 - *Limited hours (service for on-site consumption closed by 8 pm)*
- *Bars*
 - *Meal is provided – Open with Restaurant modifications*
 - *No meal provided – Closed*
- *Museums*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** capacity
- *Places of Worship*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** of capacity, or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- *Movie Theaters*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** of capacity, or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- *Hotels and Lodging*
 - Can Open Fitness Centers - **10%** capacity
 - Indoor Pools Closed
 - Outdoor Spas can open with modifications
 - **Town Lodging Order rescinded March 11, 2021**
- *Gyms and Fitness Centers*
 - Max **10%** capacity
 - Indoor Pools Closed
- *Family Entertainment Centers (including Bowling Alleys & Climbing Walls)*
 - Outdoor Only

STATE PROVIDES NEW AND UPDATED GUIDANCE



As California reopens, it's important to follow local public health guidelines for everyone's safety.

- **New: Outdoor Seated Live Events and Performances**
 - *This guidance is not intended for convention-style events or general admission venues/activities where the central activity allows or requires patrons to move around shared space*
- **New: Commencement and Graduation Ceremonies**
- **New! Updated Travel Advisory: Travel Advisory (ca.gov)**
 - *Aligns with CDC recommendations. Fully vaccinated travelers are less likely to get and spread COVID-19, and can travel safely within the United States and California*
- **Updated: State Updates Blueprint to Allow Additional Activities with Modifications to Reduce Risk**
 - *Updates to gatherings, receptions, conferences, and indoor live events and performances are effective April 15*
- **Updated: Amusement Parks and Theme Parks**
- **Updated: Outdoor and Indoor Youth and Recreational Adult Sports**
- **Updated: Pharmacies and Pharmacy Staff**


VACCINATION STATS



- Mono County is still 2nd in the state behind Alpine County in the number of doses administered by the recipient's county of residence (based on doses per 100,000 population).

Across the country, about 150.3 million doses have been administered. That translates to 45 doses per hundred people. The U.S. ranks 10th in the world behind Israel.

STATE ISSUES UPDATED COVID-19 VACCINE ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES



Updated March 25, 2021:

- Beginning **April 1, 2021**, individuals age 50-64 years old will be eligible for COVID-19 vaccines.
- Beginning **April 15, 2021**, every Californian age 16 and older will become eligible for COVID-19 vaccines.
- **Mono County is currently vaccinating individuals 16 years and older.**

STATE TO RELEASE “BEYOND THE BLUEPRINT” FRAMEWORK

Later today, the State is expected to announce the next phase in the response to COVID-19 pandemic in California, tentatively titled “Beyond the Blueprint.”

- Based upon equitable vaccine availability and a consistent low burden of disease
 - Ability to schedule and receive vaccine within 2-week timeframe
 - Hospitalization rate
- The Blueprint for a Safer Economy will be retired.
- Guidelines and restrictions may still be placed on conventions, festivals, and other large events.
