






BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY



Metrics (week ending 05/08):

- ❑ Case Rate/100,000: 4.1 (increase from last week)
 - ❑ Testing Positivity rate: 1.8% (slight increase)
- As the metrics show, we have met the Testing Positivity rate (2-4.9%) and Case Rate for to advance to the Yellow Tier.

VACCINE ELIGIBILITY EXPANDS TO INDIVIDUALS AGED 12 YEARS AND UP

May 17, 2021 – On May 12, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) announced opening Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccination appointments for Californians in the 12-15 age group following the U.S. Food and Drug Administration’s (FDA) emergency use authorization. This expanded eligibility comes after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s (CDC) vaccine safety review panel and the Western States Scientific Review Workgroup recommended that the vaccine is safe and effective in protecting this age group against severe illness, hospitalization, and death.

CDPH ISSUES UPDATED MASK GUIDANCE

Mask Guidance

- California will **keep its existing guidance around masks in place until June 15** when California aims to fully reopen the economy.
- As of May 3, 2021, face coverings are no longer required outdoors except at crowded events, and for unvaccinated people, when physical distancing cannot be maintained. In indoor settings outside of one's home, including public transportation and schools, face coverings continue to be required regardless of vaccination status.
- After June 15, California plans to implement the CDC's guidelines around masking to allow fully vaccinated Californians to go without a mask in most indoor settings. This four-week period will give Californians time to prepare for this change while we continue our relentless focus on delivering vaccines, particularly in underserved communities.

CDC ISSUES UPDATED PUBLIC HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE (04/27)

Fully vaccinated people can:

- Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Visit with unvaccinated people (including children) from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Participate in outdoor activities and recreation without a mask, except in certain crowded settings and venues
- Resume domestic travel and refrain from testing before or after travel or self-quarantine after travel
- Refrain from testing before leaving the United States for international travel (unless required by the destination) and refrain from self-quarantine after arriving back in the United States
- Refrain from testing following a known exposure, if asymptomatic, with some exceptions for specific settings
- Refrain from quarantine following a known exposure if asymptomatic
- Refrain from routine screening testing if asymptomatic and feasible
