



5. The Approval Authority determines that issuance of the permit is in the best interests of the community, the County, and its citizens and visitors, based on the following:

5.1 The experience and qualifications of the applicant and any persons involved in the management of the proposed cannabis business:

- Background in business and Project Management
- Resumes Attached
- Applicants prepared to make statement

5.2 Whether there are specific and articulable positive or negative impacts on the surrounding community or adjacent properties from the proposed cannabis business:

- Mitigated Negative Declaration for Use Permit
- With mitigations, impacts less than significant
- Support and opposition from surrounding community

5.3 The adequacy and feasibility of business, operations, security, waste management, odor control, and other plans or measures submitted by the applicant:

- Multi-Department review of operations, security and waste management
- Odor management plan adopted with Use Permit

5.4 Whether granting the permit will result in an undesirable overconcentration of the cannabis industry in a limited number of persons or in a limited geographic area within the County:

- One cannabis cultivation permit approved and operating in Antelope Valley
- Applicants have no ownership in other cannabis operations in Mono County

5.5 Environmental impacts/benefits of the cannabis business such as waste handling, recycling, water treatment and supply, use of renewable energy or other resources, etc.:
