CalFresh Emergency Allotments Set to End March 2023

MONO COUNTY, Calif. (FEBRUARY 21, 2023) – The temporary increase to CalFresh (federally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or SNAP) benefit amounts enacted at the beginning of the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic are set to expire in March 2023 per the End of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. A final CalFresh Emergency Allotment will be issued in March 2023, and recipients will return to their original CalFresh benefit amount in April 2023.

In March 2020, Congress authorized Emergency Allotments to help individuals and families meet food needs, providing between \$95 - \$400 in additional financial benefit per family each month. CalFresh benefit amounts are based upon individual circumstances, including household size, income, and deductions.

The CalFresh program provides monthly benefits in the form of an electronic benefit card to assist low-income households in purchasing the food they need to maintain adequate nutritional levels.
