

Want more non-motorized trails in Mono County?

Who: **Community Service Area 1 (CSA1) / Mono County Sustainable Recreation**



What: **CSA1 is requesting user support for a future multi-use non-motorized trail network in South County**

Where: **Crowley Lake community area**

Details: CSA1 is a dependent district of Mono County Government that provides enhanced service to CSA1 residents (Long Valley, McGee Creek, Crowley Lake, Aspen Springs, Toms Place/Sunny Slopes). Recreation is one of the enhanced services.

CSA1 is proposing; 1) to legalize an existing 1.4-to-1.6-mile trail from Tom's Place down to Lower Rock Creek Trail and 2) to legalize an existing 1.3-mile trail from the Hilton Creek Trailhead, west above the Crowley Lake BLM Campground. Both of these trails could use a few reroutes to make them more user friendly and prevent additional erosion.

Process: Since these proposed projects are on federal land managed by Inyo National Forest and Bureau of Land Management, Mono County will need permission from these agencies. CSA1 via the Mono County Board of Supervisors will request both the Inyo National Forest and Bureau of Land Management to consider the above projects into future agency work plans. CSA1 anticipates Board of Supervisor consideration of this issue in the spring 2024.
