Every 10 years, the U.S. government counts *every* person living in the U.S., through the census. Make sure that you are counted to get your **fair share** of resources and representation!

## Being counted in the census helps you and your family.

- Data from the census are used to divide over **\$800 billion dollars** of government funding for important services, like schools, libraries, food stamps, and health care.
- Data from the census are also used to divide political representation in Congress, in your state capitol, and in cities across the country. A complete count means fair representation for your community.

## Your census responses are confidential.

- The Census Bureau is not allowed to share your individual information with other government agencies, immigration officials, or the public.
- Strong laws protect your response from being shared!
- By law, your census response can only be used for statistical purposes.

## The census asks basic questions about you and the people in your home.

- The census asks for your name, age, date of birth, sex, race, ethnicity, and relationship to other people in your household. It also asks whether you rent or own your home.
- Each household should fill out a form. Remember to include *everyone* who lives at your address, including babies, relatives, and roommates.
- The census will NOT ask about citizenship or immigration status.

## Responding to the census is quick and simple.

- You can respond online. The Census Bureau will send you instructions in mid-march 2020. Once you get those instructions, go to the official census website, enter your household ID, and then answer the questions.
- You can respond by phone. Call the Census Bureau to answer the census by phone provided with the instructions and ask questions about the census.
- If you do not respond to the census online or by phone, the Census Bureau will mail you a **paper questionnaire.**

If you do not respond, starting in May 2020, a census employee might come to your home to ask for the information in person.

## Have you moved?

If your mailing address has changed and we have not been notified, you cannot receive your vote by mail ballot. To avoid delays in receiving your vote by mail ballot, please contact us immediately.

## Late ballots

Voted ballots must be returned in person to any polling place or the elections office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Your ballot may also be postmarked on Election Day and received by March 6<sup>th</sup> and it will still count!

## Vote and return your ballot early

Mail your ballot early to ensure it is received in time to be processed.

## To vote

To vote for a candidate, completely fill in the oval next to your choice.

To vote on any measure, completely fill in the oval next to the word "YES" or the word "NO".

## Important:

Check both the front and the back of your ballot for voting contests. Do not use red ink.

## To vote for a qualified write-in candidate:

To vote for a write-in candidate, write the person's name in the blank space provided directly below the names of the other candidates for the office. Then completely fill in the oval next to your choice.

## **Review your ballot:**

If you vote for more candidates than allowed, or if you vote both Yes and No on a measure, your vote will not count for that contest.

You do not have to vote on all contests. Those you do vote on will still count. If you make a mistake ask for another ballot.

All precincts in Mono County will have election materials available for voters in Spanish. You can request a Spanish translation of your ballot on Election Day at your polling location. To request a Spanish translation of your ballot when voting by mail, please contact the elections office at 760-932-5537.

## VOTER BILL OF

## YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:

The right to vote if you are a registered voter.

You are eligible to vote if you are:

- a U.S. citizen living in California
- at least 18 years old
- registered where you currently live
- not in prison or on parole for a felony



The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list. You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.



The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.



The right to cast a secret ballot without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.



The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:

Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot; or

**Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot** for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place; or

**Vote using a provisional ballot,** if you do not have your original vote-by-mail ballot.



The right to get help casting your ballot from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.



The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in the county where you are registered to vote.



The right to get election materials in a language other than English if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.



The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.



The right to report any illegal or fraudulent

**election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.
