NOTICE REGARDING BURN DEBRIS DO NOT REMOVE BURNED DEBRIS FROM YOUR PROPERTY.

Ash and debris from burned buildings and homes contains toxic substances due to the presence of synthetic and hazardous materials. Mono County has requested assistance from state agencies to assess properties impacted by the Pack Fire for removal of household hazardous waste, asbestos containing materials, radiation producing materials, and e-waste, as well as removal of burn debris and ash. Household Hazardous Waste includes unused or leftover portions of products used in your home that contain toxic chemicals. Products labeled *Caution*, *Warning*, *Danger*, *Poison*, *Toxic*, *Flammable* or *Corrosive* are considered hazardous.

Examples of Household Hazardous Wastes are:

- Aerosols
- Antifreeze
- Auto Batteries
- Auto Fluids
- Household Cleaners
- Fertilizer
- Latex/Oil-Based Paint
- Pesticides
- Pool Chemicals
- Propane Tanks (less than 30 gallons)
- Solvents
- Used Oil and Oil Filters

Household hazardous waste (HHW) must be handled separately from other burn debris and **cannot** go into local landfills. It is illegal to transport any hazardous waste on public roads or state highways without a permit. Residents are strongly urged to leave all burn debris in place because it may contain HHW and are encouraged to not remove or disturb any burn debris that may contain HHW from their properties.

IMPORTANT: Information regarding state debris removal project is forthcoming. Removal of debris from your property prior to commencement of state removal project will make you ineligible to participate and could negatively impact your insurance claim(s).
