## THE POSITION

Mono County is seeking a Public Health Nurse (PHN) for the position of Health Program Manager. This position will be trained as a PHN generalist. Responsibilities include the oversight of California Children's Services (CCS), California Health and Disability Prevention Program (CHDP) and Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care (HCPCFC). These programs fall under the Children's Medical Services (CMS) Program, and the Health Program Manager will function as the CMS Director as mandated by the State of California. The PHN will also participate in and assist with other Public Health programs such as Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health (MCAH) and Emergency Preparedness.

A Health Program Manager typically performs the following duties:

- Participates in the overall activities of the Public Health Department
- Plans, organizes, conducts and evaluates one or more public health programs
- Develops and/or adapts public health programs in coordination with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and granting agencies
- Assesses individual and community health needs to direct program services
- Prepares appropriate reports
- Coordinates any necessary committees in the program area using a multidisciplinary team approach
- Represents the Health Department on committees as necessary

- Advocates with leadership groups and elected leaders for the advancement of public health policy through community collaboration
- Plans and implements ongoing information updates with medical providers, hospitals, community based agencies, social and health service agencies, educational agencies, and the community as related to the programs
- Communicates local health needs to community leaders, agencies and the public
- Assist in program budget development and management
- Identifies, plans and directs staff in-service training and education
- Supervises Public Health staff as required
