With the coming of fishing season and the summer tourist season the traffic on Bruce St. grows exponentially. While the number of cars is to be expected, the speed at which many of our out of town guests and even some locals travel is not safe. Often there are cars going 40-45 miles an hour while hauling both RV trailers, boats, and other items that would make stopping in a hurry an impossible feat. Often these individuals are likewise engaged in conversation with their fellow vacationers and not paying attention to how fast they are going down this residential street or whom is on the side of the road.

We have 8 elementary and younger aged children that live in the neighborhood who play in their yards adjoining the street as well as use the street to get to the park, library, lake, and friends houses. In addition there is the Little Loopers Day Care at the end of the street comprising of 6 children as well as the many children guests of the Gull Lake Lodge. The speeding cars, SUVs, RVs, and trucks are incongruent with the safety of the children, adults, and pets walking along Bruce. Many of our camp visitors enjoy skateboarding, bicycling, and walking up and down Bruce street as well. Their safety is threatened as well by people speeding up and down Bruce street with little care to the pedestrians.

We, the neighbors of Bruce Street propose that speed bumps be installed the weekend before Fishmas and then removed at the close of the fishing season for snow removal. This will help everyone remember to travel at a safe speed and reduce the risk of a tragic accident which can be easily prevented.



Proposed is that the first be installed at 1 on the map and the second at 2 and a third at 3. Of course the Road Works department might have ideas on placement.

If the county roads department needs somewhere to store the speed bumps we can provide covered winter storage.
