A. USE PERMIT 23-XXX/EI Remy Food Truck at The Lift (~ 1:30 pm) Review and accept for processing an application for a Use Permit (or downgrade to DR or Special Events permit) for the installation and operation of a temporary food truck at 2587 Hwy 158 in June Lake (APN 015-086-001). The parcel is designated Commercial (C) and contains an existing residential unit and restaurant. The owner proposes to lease the existing snow storage space during summer months only to a food truck operator to best utilize the space for economic development and provide more food and beverage options in June Lake.
