1. Opportunity for the Public to Address the Council

On items of public interest that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Council (speakers may be limited in speaking time depending upon the press of business and number of people wishing to address the Council).

2. Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council Minutes

Approval of April 23, 2025, and January 21, 2026, Minutes.

- Molly DesBaillets makes a motion to approve the minutes. DA Anderson seconds. PD Ibrahim abstains. Motion passes.

3. Public Defender Representative Update

PD Jeremy Ibrahim was introduced as the representative for the Public Defenders on both the JJCC and SB 823 Subcommittee. He replaced PD Josh D. Hillemeier.

4. FY 2025-2026 Budget Review

Interim Chief Barkley presented the revenues, expenditures, and the current fund balance. No action was required.

5. Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act & Youthful Offender Block Grant Data Outcomes

Interim Chief Barkley explained the difference between the JJCPA and YOBG funding streams. She discussed the data points over the years, and the trend of juvenile crime in Mono County and the preventative efforts that have contributed to the trend.

6. FY 2026-2027 Funding Proposal: Risking Connection: Advancing Trauma-Informed Care and Racial Trauma Healing

- John Engel and Ryan Howard presented how the model from the Advancing Trauma Informed Care has been integrated in many agencies and how it may benefit Mono County. Ryan Howard provided his experience in Inyo County.
- JJCC members had concerns as to whether Mono County BOS or CAO were invested in this County wide training. In addition, JJCPA and YOBG funding may not be the appropriate funding source to fund a County wide training.
- Molly DesBaillets mentioned that the CAO advised her the County is interested in the program and to seek funding.
- The request was \$119,460.00.
- Molly made the motion to approve the funding, Janice seconds. 5 opposed. Motion did not pass. Recommendation of the council was to perhaps seek other partnerships, and the council may consider partially funding the program as they understand the benefit of the program.

7. FY 2026-2027 Funding Proposal: Public Defender Training Requirements

- Public Defender Jeremy Ibrahim went on to present his proposal requesting \$6,000.00 for the Fiscal Year for training that enhances juvenile defense representation and improves youth outcomes.
- DA Anderson motions to approve the funding proposal of \$6000. Molly seconds. Motion passes.

8. Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act & Youthful Offender Block Grant (JJCPA-YOBG) 2025-2026 Consolidated Annual Plan and Juvenile Justice Realignment Block Grant SB 823

- JJCC reviewed plan and approved the added changes, including the Public Defenders funding request.
- Superintendent Nguyen made a motion to approve the plan and PD Ibrahim seconds. Motion passes.

9. Round Table

Opportunity for members to highlight ongoing work, challenges, and opportunities relevant to juvenile prevention efforts. *No action will be taken on this item.*

- Interim Chief Barkley advised on current vacancies and recruitment.
- Molly provided an update on the fairs that have taken place is was thankful for agencies participation.
- Superintendent Nguyen shared that April is Child Abuse Prevention Month and the raising the flag ceremony.
- Deputy Director Cooper shared that May is Foster Care Appreciation month and that she has two new staff members.
