Re: REQUEST FOR INFORMATION – Regional Solid Waste Services

The Mono County Department of Public Works, Solid Waste Division (Solid Waste Division) is soliciting information from municipalities and firms experienced in providing solid waste services. The main purpose of this solicitation is to identify and formalize a mid-long term Regional Solid Waste Service Plan which will be utilized to prepare a Request for Proposals and/or Bids. Responses to this Request for Information on Regional Solid Waste Services may provide details on all services or a portion thereof. For those services which do not have details, it should be generally described as to how those services will be addressed.

1. <u>Scope of Services</u>

Respondents to this solicitation shall describe how the plan to address funding, design, construction, labor, equipment, materials, supplies, transportation, disposal, taxes, land acquisition and all other costs required to perform, upon request by Solid Waste Division, regional solid waste services, including but not limited to the following:

- Identify whether services are intended to cover either or both Unincorporated Mono County and the Town of Mammoth Lakes;
- Commercial and residential collection of solid waste and recyclables as a Mono County Franchisee;
- Operation of Mono County's six (6) existing Transfer Station Facilities which are located in Pumice valley, Walker, Paradise, Chalfant, Benton and Bridgeport. (Proposals that eliminate from or add to the existing Transfer Stations will be considered.) Operation of the transfer stations shall include hauling of all materials;
- Development and operation of a Solid Waste Facility to collect, handle, sort, categorize, dispose and/or haul Municipal Solid Waste and Recyclables which shall be located within proximity to the Town of Mammoth Lakes or perhaps nearby in Unincorporated Mono County (Solid waste and recyclables from this facility may be transferred out of Mono County);
- Development and operation of an Industrial Scale Facility to collect, handle, sort, categorize, dispose and/or haul Wood Waste, Inert Aggregate Material, Scrap Metal, Automobiles, Sludge, Tires, Construction and Demolition Waste, Electronic Waste, Trailers, Mobile Homes, White Goods/ Appliances and Household Hazardous Waste; (This

facility may be in conjunction with any of the above mentioned facilities) Operation of the industrial scale facility shall include hauling of all materials;

- Establishment of Price Per Ton for Collection and Disposal of
 - MSW / CD / Organics / Sludge;
- Meet state mandates for diversion and recycling;
- Fully operational by January 1, 2023.

Respondents should provide sufficient detail as to how the above requested services will be addressed as well as provide a minimum operating time frame desired.

Upon request by Solid Waste Division, the responding municipality(ies) or firm(s) shall provide further details to Mono County Public Works Director, the Solid Waste Division Superintendent, or an authorized representative of either in order to prepare a Regional Solid Waste Service Plan and subsequent requests.
