# Public Comment:

Bruce Woodworth commented that when there are Hot Items on the BOS agenda, the BOS meeting should be held in the affected area (referencing the recent BOS meeting potentially impacting the Paramedic program)

Mike Curti discussed the issues around ISOMA and a push towards privatization of the paramedic and ambulance services.

Judy Curti informed the group that fraudulent tax returns had been filed in their names.

# Informational / Discussion of Actions

#### Mountain Gate:

Arden Gerbig discussed the current ongoing construction of Mtn Gate Phase II. The contractor would like to close the access to vehicles. Phase III was outlined as potential improvements to the undeveloped County parcel south of Walker, north of Mt Gate Park, south of Eastside Ln Bridge and west of the Walker River. A list of possible features including but not limited to a parking area, fishing platforms, Pedestrian bridge over river, trail connecting to existing Mt Gate Park, restrooms. Bruce Woodworth developed an outline for potential improvements, limitations, and modifications to the site.

# USFS Update: No Report

#### MWTC Update: No Report

Ned Welsh informed us that a Meeting has been scheduled with the Commander on May 7<sup>th</sup> to happen prior to the AVRPAC meeting for those that would like to meet and talk with the Commander.

### Tennis Court as Dog Rest Area:

Discussion around benefits of having a designated dog area in the existing abandoned tennis court across from the park and Walker Community Center. Fesko volunteered to donate fencing to create the double barrier for entry to the dog area. Elena Espinosa is gathering volunteers to patrol the area. Local residents, Evan and Thadra Nikirk expressed their support for a designated dog area and commented on the high use the rest area receives. Motion was made by Orval Mosby and seconded by Bruce Woodworth to support Elena Espinosa in the creation of a dog rest area.

# Eastern Sierra Transit Authority:

John Helm shared the local ESTA routes available in our area. He also shared information on the defunct vanpool program.

Vans are available if a critical mass of riders can commit to regular times/routes.

John also shared the non emergency medical transport services. Medical transport is reimbursable at \$0.23/mile. The Transit Analyst has the application materials for reimbursement. Solicited for unmet transit needs.

# Supervisor's Report:

Tim Fesko reported:

Bill VanLente's application as member of the AVRPAC was approved. Supervisor Johnston expressed his concerns over the lack of term limits for the AVRPAC. Tim officially resigned from the AVRPAC effective February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015 but will still continue to participate as a guest with the Supervisor's Report. County mid year budget review running a deficit of <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> million. Paramedics were funded for this fiscal year. Additional Fish stocking funding not approved. A Blue Ribbon Committee is looking into issues surrounding the expense of the paramedic program. Monday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm Tim will be holding an informational community meeting about the paramedic program.

# Mono County Strategic Planning:

Jim Leddy was unable to attend. He will be seeking input from the RPAC next month on potential projects fitting into the categories of the Mono County Strategic Plan

# Status of the Antelope Valley General Plan update as recommended by the RPAC:

Gerry LeFrancois reported that the General and Regional plans are pit for review. We looked at the AVRPAC General Plan Objective C: Policy 3 and the statement around not invoking eminent domain to secure properties for planning purposes (pertinent to our discussions around trail planning). He said the Transportation Plan will approved before the General or Regional plans.

# Trails Planning within Walker and Regional Trail Options:

Gerry is obtaining a USFS map showing all of the roads within the Toiyabe Natl Forest. The Toiyabe Health Clinic has funds for grants. Planning met with the Tribe to look at the Grant Program. Grant monies may be available if the proposed project ties into Camp Antelope.
