





Fishing Is Still Our #1 Recreation Activity

Fishing Brings In 412,695 Visitors To Our Town, a season. With An Estimated \$18 Million Value To The County In Revenues.

- 121 Rental Boats, Capacity Of 484 People.
 7 Pontoon Boats, Capacity Of 56 People.
 Total On The Water Capacity Of 540 People (Not Include Private Boats & Float Tubes).
- Shore Fishing Is Unlimited. Estimate Are Upwards Of 1500 People Shore Fishing.
- There Are Plenty Of Other Fishing Opportunities Minutes Away.
- Water Sport Activities Are Paddle Boats, Kayaks, And Canoes.
- Water Sports On Grant Lake (Skiing, Seadoo, Wakeboarding).

(Formula for fishing visitor: # of lodging pillows =1961 + # of campground sites X 2 people =1096. Times 75%. Times 180 days of Fishing Season)

- On full day, ½ day and 1 hour rides, there is unlimited potential for growth.




Bicycling is under utilized, on the Loop



AVERAGE COMMERCE OF 304 DAYS PER YEAR.

- Fishing closes on November 15
- June Mountain, historically, opens for the Christmas holiday and closes at Easter (Mid-April)
- Opening of fishing season last Saturday of April.

- It is hard on businesses to stay afloat. Imagine if you went without a paycheck for 2 months.
- Without a sustainable economy, all public services decrease, i. e., emergency services, schools, churches, parks, and roads.
