1. Call to Order

Chairperson Lund called the meeting to order as of 10:00 a.m.

2. Introductions of Advisory Council Members and Staff

Everyone announced their name and their role. Quorum was established.

3. Public Comment

Chairperson Lund invited Public Comment. No public comment was given.

4. Approval of minutes from June 14, 2023 meeting - ACTION

5. Staff Reports – DISCUSSION

a. Administration Report – Ms. Willis-Wagoner is working on the next 4-year Area Plan. A statewide survey went out to residents of Inyo and Mono Counties. Not all community members received the survey; feedback will be given at a future meeting.

- b. ESAAA Data Report Ms. Willis-Wagoner asked California Department of Aging data staff to re-open the 4th quarter report, pending additional data. She will have an update at the next meeting.
- c. Inyo County and Mono County Program Services Update Inyo County-New employees: Luz Nunez (Lone Pine Program Services Assistant (PSA), Christina Bonanno (Senior Services Supervisor), Lisa Allsup, (Bishop PSA). Deferred Maintenance at the Bishop Senior Center is beginning in January. A Behavioral Health Nurse is visiting sites. The flu clinics started in November. Staff are having emergency preparedness demonstrations. California Indian Legal Services (CILS) has been visiting sites for outreach.
 - Mono County- Cassidy Miles replaced Patricia Espinosa at the Walker Site. Recent events for Walker participants include a fall colors field trip, BINGO, hosting yoga, craft projects, access technology grants., The Walker dietician site review went well.
 - Ms. Lund made note that Big Pine Town Hall was infested with black widows, they notified County, and it was taken care of quickly.
- d. LTC Ombudsman October is residents' rights month. The Ombudsman Program will distribute information to Bishop Care Center and the Southern Inyo Hospital Skilled Nursing Facility in English and Spanish. Ms. Erwin is going to the fall Ombudsman Conference where she was asked to give a presentation on resident family councils. The program had the first in-person family council meeting, which is now offered in-person or virtual. The Mandated Reporting flow chart is on the Governor's desk pending approval to simplify for staff in Long Term Care facilities. Mr. Ryan (SIH) acknowledged Ms. Erwin for LTC assistance, resident rights advocacy and help educating staff. Ms. Erwin is providing Mandated Reporter training for both skilled nursing facilities in Inyo County.
- e. Other Area Partner Program Reports Ms. Manross brought up the list of grant funds and would like to see more work done around the Bishop center including heating & air in the computer room since there is no heat or air, discussed portable heaters; gutter over the entry to east side of building is still having issues; also requesting the outside light over rec room be replaced. The Bishop Senior Recreation Committee is hosting the fall bizarre on Nov. 18th and Christmas Candy sales in December.

6. Senior Legislature Representative- Discussion

- Ms. Scott noted that our region has been unrepresented for years in the Senior Legislature; there is a vacancy that can be filled by anyone 55 and older; representatives must be registered to vote and reside within Inyo or Mono County. To qualify, there is a nomination packet, and the application is online. Interested parties can contact Ms. Scott for more information. Basic duties are to communicate the needs of Seniors to the legislature; there may be travel to Sacramento area. We will get more information and send out another email. Ms. Erwin noted that the Long Term Care facilities and Board of Supervisors have policy areas that would benefit from having a member representing Inyo.
